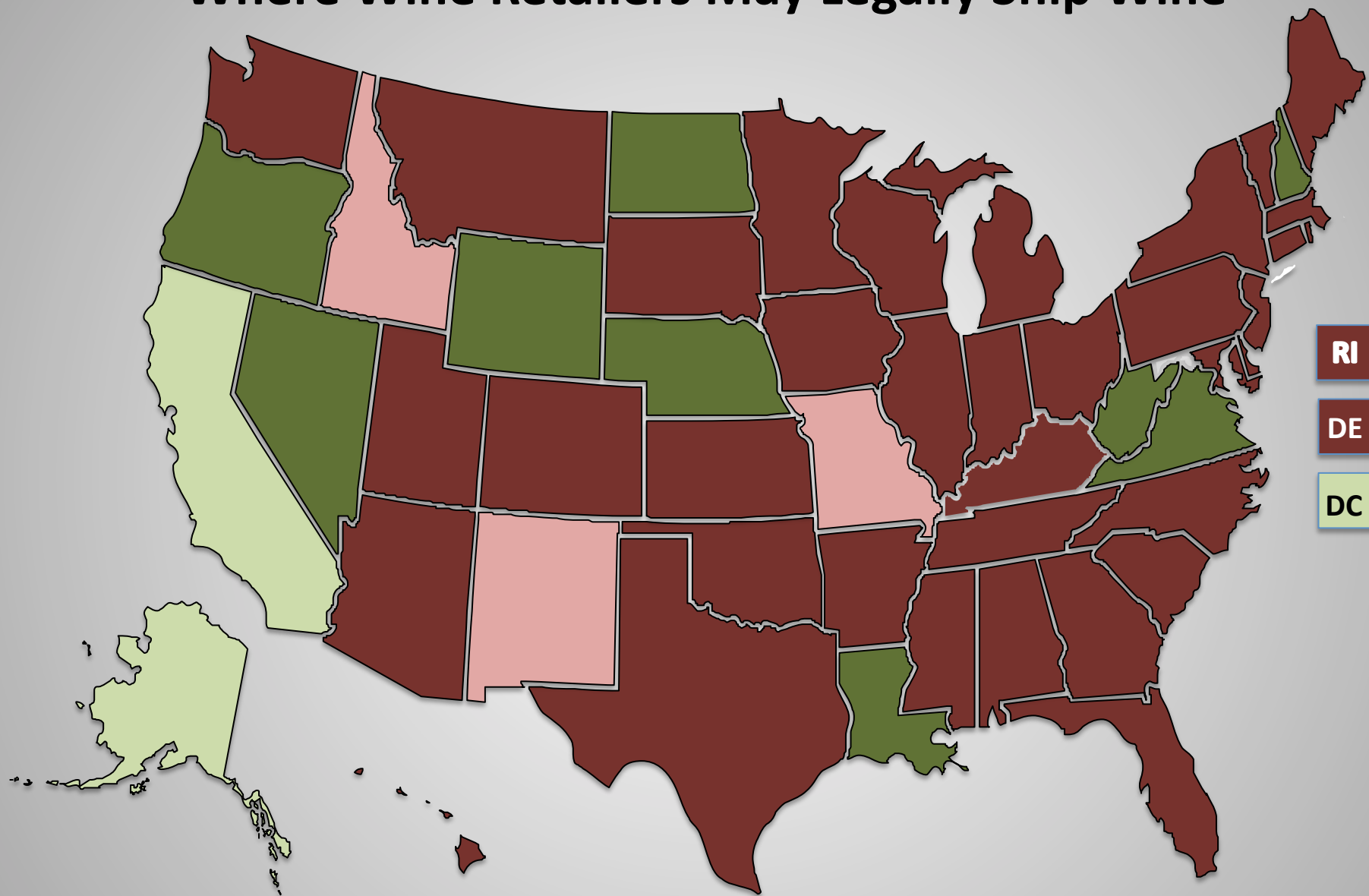


# Where Wine Retailers May Legally Ship Wine

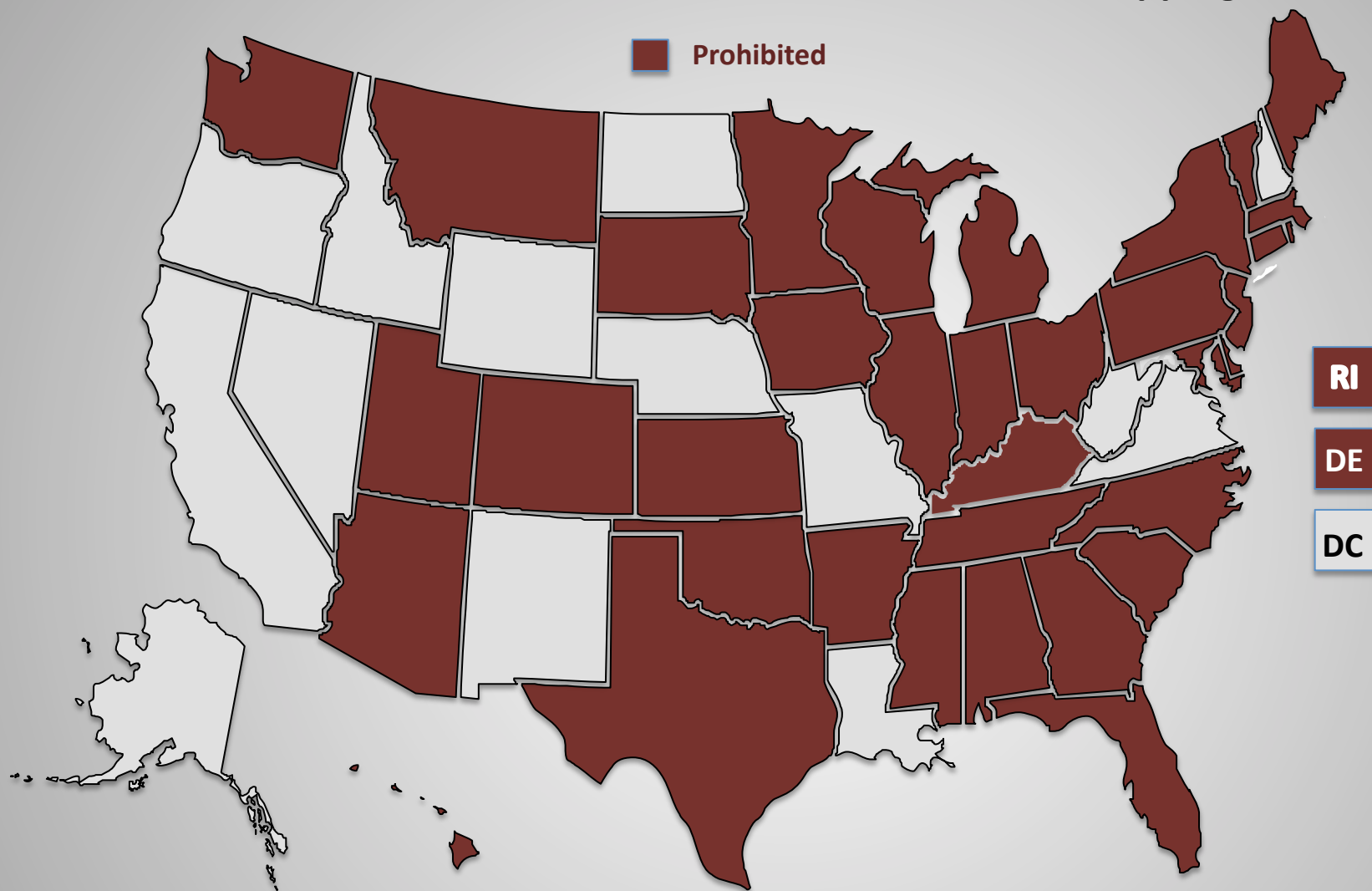

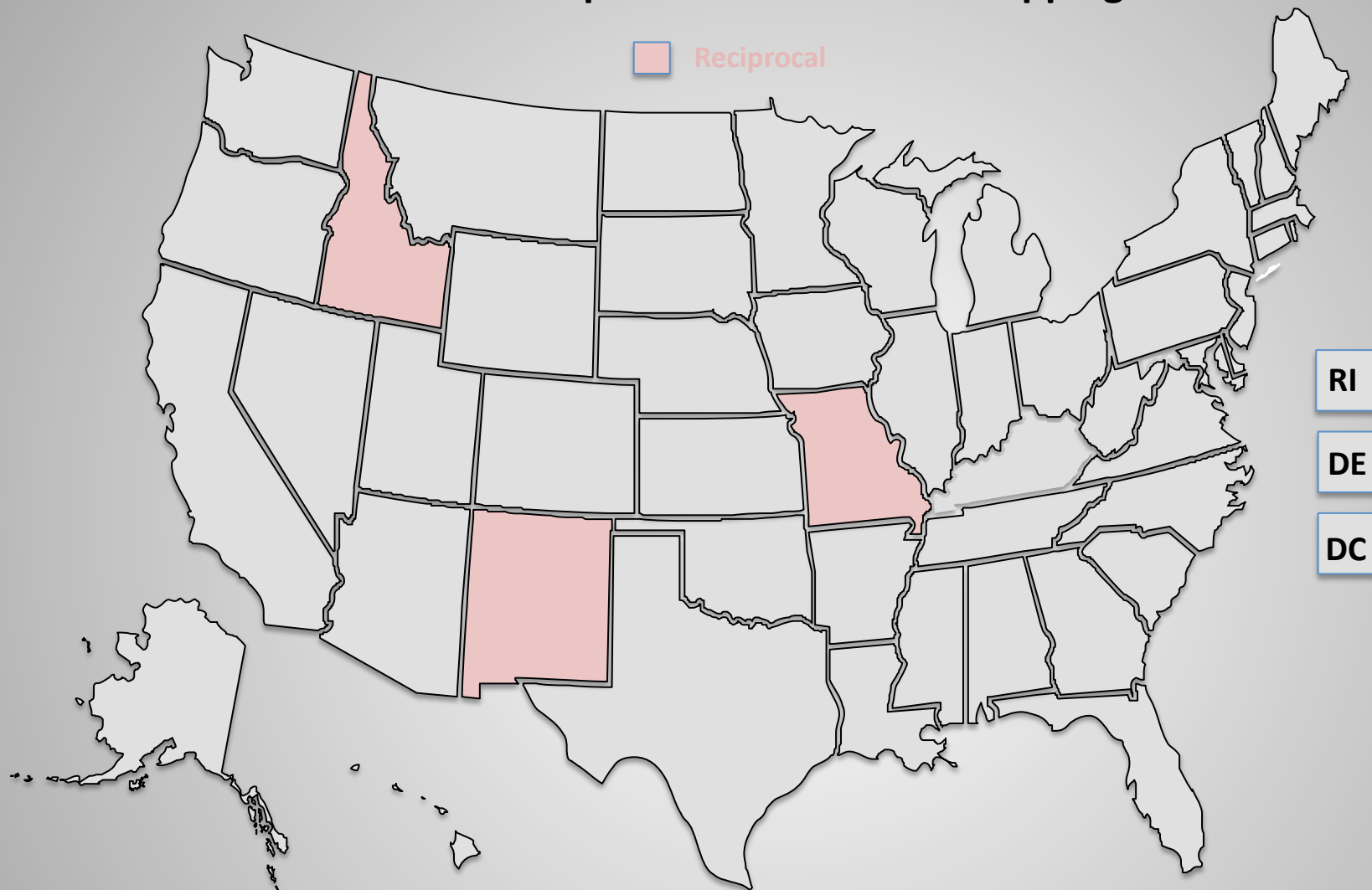

## States Where Retailers are Prohibited From shipping Wine



Prohibited state allow no retailer shipping of wine from out-of-state Retailers. The level of enforcement of the prohibition varies from State-to-state

## States With Reciprocal Retailer Wine Shipping Laws



Reciprocal States only allow shipment from retailers in states where its own Retailers are allowed to ship to. For example, because New Mexico is a Reciprocal state and since New York allows no out-of-state retailer shipments, New York retailers may not ship to New Mexico. No permits are needed.

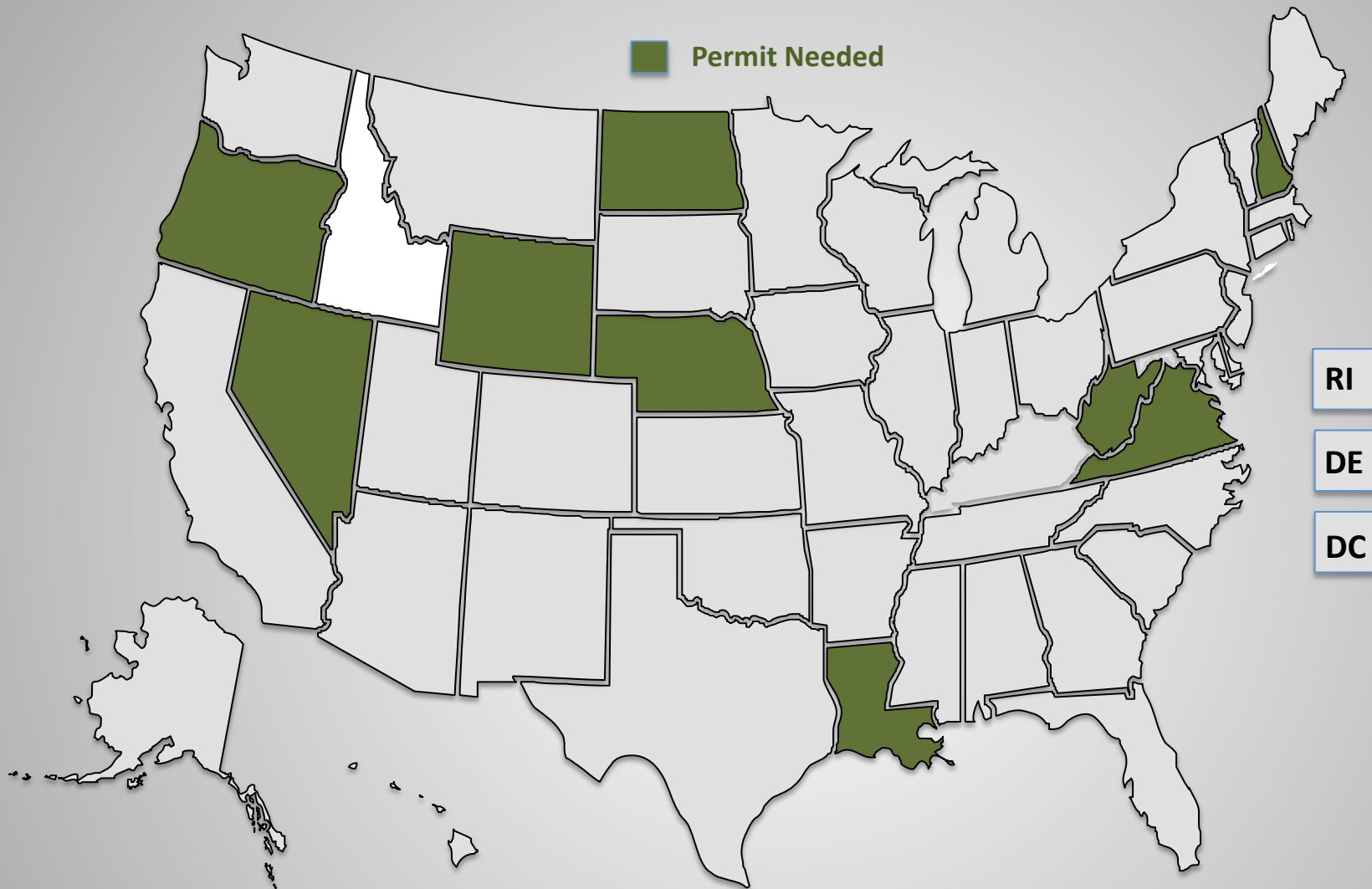
## States Retailers May Ship To Without Any Permits



\* *Technically, CA is a Reciprocal state. However, the CA ABC has in place a non-enforcement policy.*

Three states, CA, AK and DC, allow out-of-state wine retailers to ship Wine without any permits or remittance of taxes or fees

## States Retailers May Ship To With Permits



These states allow out-of-state retailers to ship wine after obtaining a permit or license from the state. Most often, the conditions of the permit include remittance of sales tax, volume reporting, and submitting to local regulatory and legal jurisdictions.
