Permit Laws VS. Reciprocity Laws

PERMIT LAWS:

Any retailer in any state may apply for a state's Shipping Permit.

RECIPROCITY LAWS:

State A issues permits to retailers in State B—but only if State B allows State A's Retailers to ship to State B.



Permit Laws: PROS & CONS

PROS:

- 1. Permits Are Issued to Retailers In Any State
- 2. No Constitutional Issues With law
- 3. Allows Consumers Maximum Access to U.S. Wine Marketplace

CONS

- 1. Often Seen As Direct Competition To Retailers in States Passing the Law
- 2. Less Likely To Gain Support From In-State Retailers



Reciprocity: PROS & CONS

PROS:

- 1. More Likely To Receive Support From In-State Retailers
- 2. Allows Lawmakers To Claim Protection for In-State Retailers

CONS

- 1. Places Restrictions on Retailer Shipping From Many States
- 2. Reciprocity is Constitutionally Questionable
- 3. Motivates Other States to Pass Reciprocity Laws Rather Than Permit Laws
- 4. Limits the retailers from whom consumers may purchase



Strategies For Legislative Success

1. In-state Retailer Support

Support from in-state consumers is the biggest challenge and the the most likely avenue for legislative success

1. Citizen Lobbying

Lawmakers must know there is support by constituents.

1. In-State Lobbyist On The Team

Personal connections with lawmakers are critical. Almost impossible to move a bill without professional help

Senate Bill 353

Would rescind right of right of out-of-state retailers to ship into State

Status: Vote On Senate Floor Scheduled For February 15th

NAWR View: **OPPOSED**



Massachusetts

House Bill 3891



Would allow out-of-state wine retailers to ship into the state and allow in-state retailers to ship outside the state

Status: Awaiting decision by Joint Committee on Licensure

NAWR View: SUPPORT



Rhode Island



Senate Bill 2107

Would allow out-of-state wine retailers and wineries to ship into the state

Status: Awaiting a committee hearing at the end of the month or early March.

Connecticut

Retailer Shipping Bill AND Common Carrier Reporting Bill

Status: Awaiting Introduction

Senate Bill 243

Allows wine shipping only for out of state wineries

Status: Awaiting Hearing Date

NAWR View: SUPPORT Only With Amendments



Missouri



NO BILL YET

Working with a set of consumer to move a senator toward sponsoring bill

Status: Awaiting Introduction

NAWR View: No Position Yet



Mississippi



House Bill 98

Would allow wine shipments from out-of-state wineries and retailers

Status: Died In Committee

New York



Assembly Bill 5991 (SB 5330)

Would allow wine shipments from out-of-state retailers on a reciprocal basis.

Status: In Committees Awaiting Hearing
